

SOCAN in Action – 2017 Plans

Water Management & Conservation continue to collaborate with other groups to manage and educate about the threat climate change poses to water resources.

Climate in the Classroom will make presentations at schools and collaborate with teachers.

Master Climate Protector's 10-week Pilot begins February 9 from 6-9pm. Public course begins Sept 2017. Funds needed: \$2,500 + \$17,500 for coordinator.

Transportation will promote reduction in greenhouse gas emissions from this sector.

Forests & Fire will support proposals to manage for healthy resilient forests identified at the **Rogue Basin Forest Workshop**.

Government will continue to meet with elected officials and engage in the development of statewide greenhouse gas emissions

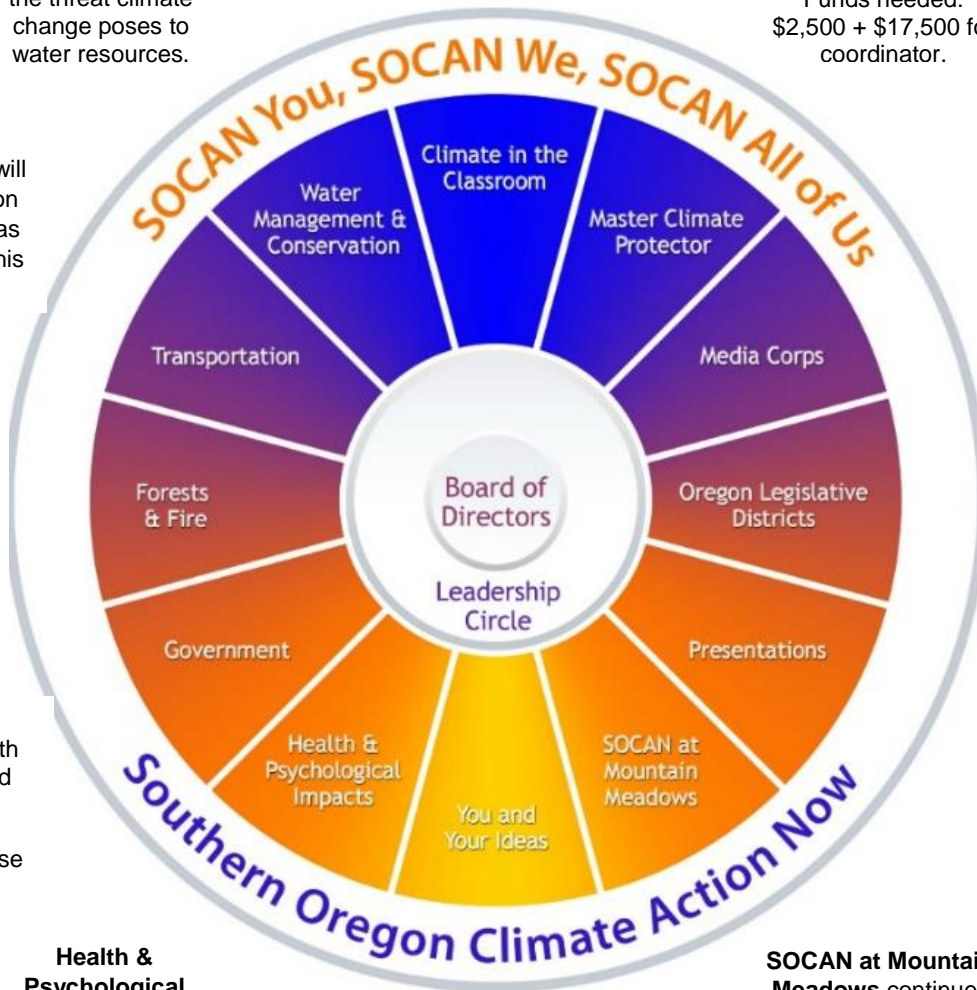
Health & Psychological Impacts will continue development of the "Voices of the Valley" multimedia project. Funds needed: \$3,000

SOCAN at Mountain Meadows continues to work on transportation issues and the Ashland Climate & Energy Action Plan.
