

Justice framework





Doctrine of Discovery

- 15th century papal bulls
- Church sanctioned land seizure by nations if the land was not peopled by Christians, slavery to bring people to Christianity
- Claiming a whole watershed when "discovering" the mouth of a river
- Land and property rights: white,
 propertied men could vote
- Manifest Destiny, colonialist forms of missions, labor and resources support the empire







Treaty People Gathering





- Purpose: Pres. Biden cancel Line 3 tar sands
 pipeline
- 2000 people at the gathering, ~400 participated in the multifaith delegation
- Supporting Indigenous rights and protecting waterways
- Building relationships with activists in Oregon and around the country

Relationships

- Green Teams: forming teams in your local faith community
- Green Circles: connecting across faith communities to set and collaborate on shared goals




- Invite them to events or work together on actions when there are big faith community events
 - e.g. Unitrian General Assembly held a rally with Youth vs. ODOT (Sunrise PDX)





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- Collaborate on local projects and advocacy at the city/county levels
 - e.g. faith communities in Washington, DC mapped natural gas leaks, created a report in coalition with Beyond Gas DC, and presented to city council





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- Clergy and other people of faith in nonviolent direct actions
 - e.g., pipeline protests, demonstrations for divestment from fossil fuels, etc.
